The purpose of these marker commercials is to illustrate a range of commercials as they relate to the definition of a background performer. *(See abbreviated definition below)* The 2008 change in the definition allows for the increased use of background performers to enhance the quality of Canadian commercials in that a background performer can now be recognizable for 2/3rds of a second or more. Please remember that these commercials are only illustrative cases for guidelines and that your commercial may not directly parallel the example. Definition:

A207 (a) Background Performer (BP) means a Performer

(i) not otherwise classified as a Silent-on-Camera (SOC) Performer, whose face may be recognizable and who

appears solely as atmosphere and whose performance is not directly associated with the demonstration of or identified with the product or service and whose performance does not materially illustrate or react to the off-camera narration or to the commercial message being given; or

(ii) who performs special silent business for atmospheric purposes such as, but not limited to, swimming, driving or dancing unchoreographed popular dances; or

(iii) who is required to appear in evening clothes; or

(iv) who performs a skill such as, but not limited to, water-skiing or horseback riding; or

(v) who performs in a sport such as, but not limited to, football, baseball, etc.;
