Heather Allin talked about process and said that in theory a Notice of Motion can arrive at any time. It can be introduced at the current meeting to be voted upon at the next meeting.

CHAIR'S UPDATE

Tova thanked Councillors for the great work on the Op Plan. She is proud of working with a group who are doing incredible work on the Awards.

Mr. Constable then moved into the Chair.

IPA FOCUS GROUPS RECAP

Alistair Hepburn and Gail Haupert tag teamed on this file.

A Councillor said that they attended all the focus groups, except one, and was "exposed to all the nooks and crannies". They said that UBCP is doing an open call and suggested that ACTRA Toronto might think about doing the same.

Mr. Hepburn said that the proposals are drawn up from the focus groups and then the proposals are presented to the bargaining team at Wages & Working conditions.

Discussion arose on how to acknowledge members who want to attend and how to get more members to attend.

It was suggested that in future the entire Council should be able to attend focus groups.

Another Councillor said that although information is going out to members on a regular basis, how do we engage the background performers. They do not feel like they are part of ACTRA.

Further to a comment, Mr. Hepburn said that organizers are not on the sets, On Set Liaison Officers (OSLOs) go on set. The organizers are organizing non-union sets.

A Councillor said that they have spent 20 some years as an OSLO and during that time has spent a lot of time explaining what the benefits of membership are. Most people do not read their emails. As an OSLO talking to them one-on-one is important and reminding members to read their emails and attend the meetings.

Suggestions were made on how to increase engagement. One being to provide some sort of focus group compensation and another a phone tree in advance. A procedural review is in order.

Mr. Hepburn pointed out that one virtual and two in-person focus group sessions were offered and no one attended. A Councillor said that members were given short notice of those live dates and felt that if members were given more time attendance would be higher.

It was noted that the GenZ folks do not like to respond to telephone calls and preferred text messages.

IPA BARGAINING TEAM RECOMMENDATIONS (VOTE)

Mr. Hepburn reported that the Stunt Committee has voted the following two members to represent their community:

Steve "Shack" Shackleton – Primary Geoff Scovell – Alternate

As reported at the last Council meeting, Raven Dauda has now responded and has agreed to be a Primary member on the IPA Bargaining Team.

AWARDS VOLUNTEERS & UPDATE

A Councillor said that if Councillors cannot volunteer help will be sought from the Committee and Caucus Chairs to fill the gap. It was mentioned that since it is on Council to pull this off, sobriety is encouraged.

Mr. Hepburn reported that 303 of the 450 tickets were sold, including all the \$25 tickets. There are 150 tickets available which will be sold to the industry.

Martha Chaves has been confirmed as the Host of the Awards and Nneka Atto will be the Awards Announcer.

Tom Farr will be the recipient of the Outstanding Stunt Award.

Mr. Hepburn informed Council that out of 98 submissions for one of the performance awards, only 25 were for BIPOC members. Council deliberated whether a statement, which was presented to the meeting, should be issued since none of the final Nominees in that category are from the BIPOC community.

CREATOR CORNER UPDATE - GORD

Gord Rand said that he is hoping to have a feedback session with the membership regarding the process of member producers creating shows and how creativity can be served.

In response to the Apprentice Caucus Chair's query, Mr. Rand said that he is just in the beginning stage of the process and is seeking feedback from Council and others. It was suggested that Mr. Rand create a blurb that can be forwarded to the Apprentice Caucus.

A Councillor suggested that Mr. Rand take the Online Co-op Course and that he should send the link out to the people he talks to.

This has been tabled for further discussion.

COUNCIL IPA FOCUS GROUP

A fulsome IPA focus group took place.

LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT ON ACTRA TORONTO WEBSITE - JASON

Discussion arose regarding the Land Acknowledgement and where it lived on the ACTRA Toronto website. Mr. Hepburn informed Council that the document is in the Council Handbook which is on the website but not in a place that can be found easily.

Council agreed that this document needs to be refreshed and other Indigenous communities require to be consulted. In the meantime, it was agreed that the Land Acknowledgement live in the bottom banner of ACTRA Toronto's homepage.

WORD FROM SET

- There are a lot of concerns about AI in regards to audiobooks.
- A SAG-AFTRA staff member from Chicago on set was accompanied by an OSLO. They were talking to the lead SAG
 performers. Their aim is to get better terms in their agreement so that they members have better protection in
 place. We need to keep a close eye on this.

• The pandemic accommodation re A1705 should be removed so people get cash in hand. Council was reminded that there was no pandemic accommodation in A1705. Gail Haupert said that production should not add per diem on the gross total and said that members should call the office if this is happening. Per diems should be reimbursed per the actor's choosing. Mr. Hepburn said Canadian dollars and US dollars in the US or the currency of the land. Per diems are not included in the net fees. It was reported that productions are saying that they cannot give cash because it is unsanitary.

OTHER BUSINESS

NCA Task Force

Igniting a NCA Task Force. Kate Ziegler requested approval from Council to take leadership on this. They have been invited by Jamie and Jill to attend a Question Period session at Queen's Park. The two-year anniversary of the NCA lockout is approaching (May 1st). These politicians have been with us from day one. They would like 1,000 members in attendance.

Council granted approval of a Task Force which will be led by Kate Ziegler.

Notices of Motion – Gord Rand

- "Open up communications between Executive and Council and also National Council."
- "Grant a review to audit various depart at Council's will."

It was pointed out that matters at the Executive meetings are open discussion and hence not minuted. Mr. Rand said that he would like them to be run like Council meetings.

Regarding the auditing of departments, a Councillor pointed out that this cannot be done as this would mean "going into other union" territories. It was pointed out that if there are issues are staff-related then that is up to Mr. Hepburn to take up with the staff.

Life Member

Mr. Hepburn said that Council should bring forward names of members to be granted Life Membership. Every year Council grants two members to receive this honour. Council will receive a list of names of members who have been granted Life Membership in the past. A criteria for granting Life Membership will also be sent to Council.

May Council Meeting

Ms Haupert and Mr. Hepburn will be in LA to talk to studios there in May along with a contingent of film industry people representing Toronto. Mr. Hepburn's schedule is tight with various meetings, i.e. pre-bargaining session, IPA Wages and Working Conditions session, etc. He will send out a Doodle Poll to determine Council's availability.

Act Your Age (AYA) – Co-Chairs, Heather Dick and Ann Wootten

Last year's brainstorming sessions and the Christmas gathering brought requests for acting scene study workshops, self-tape help, and audition workshops. They have responded by planning two skill development workshops. Heather Dick approached the two great instructors, and they are so thrilled to have them on board.

The first is an editing self- tape workshop, called *Clipchamp Editing Workshop*. Facilitated by ACTRA member Trish Adams, it's a step by step on how to edit self-tapes using the Clipchamp app. It's a free app which everyone will download prior to the workshop. Participants can follow Ms Adams as she demonstrates on her screen. The date is Wednesday, March 27th from 1:30 – 3:00 pm. Invitations have gone out and the committee had a good response.

The second workshop is called *KISS the Callback Audition Workshop*. It's an in-person acting scene session with ACTRA member Marianne McIsaac. They will be using the ACTRA Toronto Boardroom, and out of town members can also watch from home on Zoom. The date is Wednesday, April 24th noon to 3:00 pm. AYA will be releasing more details a little closer to the event date.

A big thank you to Karl Pruner for helping them make these workshops a reality.

Child Advocate – Angelica Alejandro, Child Advocate

- Wednesday March 27th Clare Johnston and Angelica Alejandro will co-host a Parents/Guardians Zoom meeting. Since the Protecting Childs Performers Act applies to all minors, this Zoom meeting is open to parents/guardians of both Union and Non-Union minors. The intent is to bring parents/guardians together to discuss concerns, issues and respond to questions they have with respect to minors working in the industry. In her next report Ms Alejandro will provide an update on the session. They have a varied list of speakers and they will also be discussing the IPA as it pertains to minors. Similar to the IPA Focus groups that engage adult members, this Zoom is a good opportunity for parents to speak on the challenges and issues facing minors working under this agreement.
- Other initiatives that Ms Alejandro has brought forth to facilitate Minors and their Parents/Guardians: ROS for Minors 15-17 and having ACTRA Toronto start a committee similar to the UCBCP/ACTRA Guardians of Minors Committee (this was outlined in more detail in the prior report to Council).
- Communications this month to the Advocate Office have mostly been about the Zoom Meeting on the 27th from parents wanting to register and find out more information. In addition, some parents have sent in questions and issues they would like addressed, for those unable to attend Ms Alejandro has scheduled a follow-up with them after.

Diversity and Inclusion Committee – Co-Chairs, Krystle Ferdinand, Dorly Jean-Louis and Roy Urbanozo

Summary

- The committee held its first member meeting on March 4th over zoom. They had over 30 participants attend the meeting. Members in attendance were diverse in age group and number of years with ACTRA. Some were BIPOC, Full and Apprentice members, but it was noted that the vast majority of attendees were predominantly members of the Disability Alliance Sub-Committee and not members of the BIPOC community as originally expected.
- A blue-sky meeting was held between the Co-Chairs and the Staff Liaison on March 14th at the ACTRA Toronto Office.
- A meeting to discuss the next season of Working the Scene in Colour was scheduled on March 25th. They met with Louis Taylor and Lea Geronimo to gather information about the event and to schedule key dates for the initiative.
- A meeting for the Accent Discrimination Sub-Committee was held on March 27th and lead by Mladen Obradovic. Roy Urbanozo, Co-Chair, Tonjha Richardson, Lead, Disability Alliance Sub-Committee, and Staff Liaison Luisa Alvarez Restrepo were in attendance.

Objectives & Goals

• During the committee meeting, the lead of the Accent Discrimination Sub-Committee Mladen Obradovic gave an overview of the sub-committee and outlined that the challenges being faced are not just audible for members with accents but also physically as well if they fall within the BIPOC category. One point of concern is Quebec actors who come to live or work in Toronto find it difficult to find their footing. They are often excluded from many projects because of their French accent and many do not work consistently. Members "get discouraged", "don't want to try", leave or don't give themselves a chance to create a platform. This is a conversation that is overdue

- and must be had with gatekeepers. He urges "make writers our friends". Obradovic pointed out that audiences are ready and "want to see" true representation in a Country "full of Immigrants." He believes interest in Canadian content will subsequently "rise when that change occurs."
- Participants were divided into three breakout groups at the end of the committee meeting. Members were
 welcomed to share their ideas, thoughts and suggestions within their groups. Some of the initiatives that the
 members would like to see are listed below:
 - Working the Scene in Colour (Currently in progress).
 - o Picture Day (Tentatively planned to occur in November 2024).
 - o A Different Lens: Demo Reel Initiative.
 - MasterClass Casting Director Workshops/Showcases.
- During their blue-sky meeting on March 14th, they discussed additional initiatives the committee would like to undertake and support. Some of these initiatives are listed below:
 - Sandi Ross Awards at TIFF.
 - o Reelworld Short Film Competition.
 - o Authentic Accents Dialect Training for Black Performers.
 - o Black Market Showcasing Black-Owned small business services and products (Black History Month 2025).
 - o Multicultural Day An event showcasing and celebrating the music, art, clothing, dancing, traditions and food of the diverse members. The possibility of making this a fundraiser was discussed.
- Next Committee Meeting Date is Tentatively Scheduled for April 8th. Whether the meeting is hybrid or virtual is still to be determined. A poll will be sent out to the committee members to gauge feedback once again.

Supplementary Discussions

- With regards to the meeting with Mladen, there is an opportunity for the D&I Committee to collaborate with the Accent Discrimination Sub-Committee to amplify their visibility within the membership. There are plans to create a promotional video similar to outACTRAto's "Queer Your Stories", but highlighting the accents our members have, the barriers they face and how authenticity can be beneficial to a production.
- Initiated that their mandate/mission statement is unclear and that they need specificity before forging ahead.

- Asian Performer Showcase: Launched the call for submissions and vetted them as they came in. Liaised with
 industry partners such as Reel Asian, TIFF, and Reelworld to get the word out; also received support from Andrew
 Phung and Jean Yoon who shared the call on their social media. Met with the TIFF Industry team to pitch
 partnership for the Asian Performer Showcase. They are on board to do an in-person event. Ms Alvarez Restrepo

 started in the business.
- Represented ACTRA Toronto on the Unions & Guilds zoom panel hosted by Toronto Metropolitan University for students at the Creative School.
- Met with a video broadcasting company interested in working with ACTRA Toronto and offering their services to members.
- Non-union production research and outreach continues.
- Outreach to three post-secondary performance programs about ACTRA, the role of the union, the importance of becoming a member, and how to join via the New Graduate Credit:
- o Presented to 55 students in Seneca College's Acting for Camera & Voice program on March 8, 2024, with Tavia Pereira.

- o Presented to 47 students in Sheridan College's Music Theatre program with George Alevizos on March 12, 2024.
- o Presented to 35 students in Humber College's Acting for Film & Television program with Tavia Pereira on March 15, 2024.
- Attended the Sustainable Production Forum <u>Climate Action Group</u> meeting to discuss current initiatives. ACTRA Toronto has been involved with this group since autumn 2022.
- In total, there were over 1500 registrants for various industry events, panels, and presentations the union took part in this month. ACTRA Toronto is proud to connect with potential engagers and pre-members via this outreach, supporting the goal of procuring more work opportunities for union performers and growing the membership.
